SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the SI means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

1. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

2. SCHEDULE OF RACES

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Number of races: It is the intention of the Race Committee to have three (3) races per day. The OA may at its discretion increase the number of races if the Regatta is behind the schedule or the OA anticipate adverse weather conditions in the upcoming days.
No warning signal will be made after 1600 hours.

3. TIME LIMITS AND TARGET TIMES

3.1. Time limits are shown in the table below

Mark 1 Time Limit	Race Time Limit	Finishing Window	Target Time
20min	70min	15 min	45min

3.2. If no boat has passed the first mark within the mark 1 time limit or no boat finishes within the race time limit, the race will be abandoned

3.3 The finishing window is the time for boats to finish after the first boat sails the course and finishes. Boats failing to finish within the finishing window will be scored DNF without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A5.1 and A5.2.

3.4. Failure to meet the target time will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 61.1.a

4. CLASS FLAG

The class flag is a blue flag with the CISC logo.

5. THE COURSES

The courses are according to the diagrams as shown in Attachment B.

No later than the warning signal, the race committee signal vessel will communicate the approximate compass bearing of the first leg.

Unless communicated before the warning signal, the default course to be sailed is WL2.

6. MARKS

Marks 1, 2 are orange Robotic marks.

The starting/finish mark is a yellow cylindrical inflatable mark.

7. THE START

Start procedure is according to rule 26.

The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Signal boat at the starboard end and a starting mark on the port side of the line.

A boat that does not start within 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (DNS) without a hearing. This changes RRS A4 and A5.

8. CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

8.1 To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will move the original mark (or the finishing line) to a new position according to RRS 33

8.2 Action or no action by the race committee under SI 8.1 will not be grounds for redress under RRS 61.1(a).

9. THE FINISH

The finishing line will be between staff displaying Blue flag on the committee boat and a finishing mark.

10. UMPIRING

At least one umpiring boat will be umpiring the race.

Appendix UF will apply.

The umpire has the right to protest a boat that took the one turn penalty, if the infringement constitutes unfair sailing.

Failure by an umpire to impose a penalty is not ground for redress.

A boat maintains her right to protest.

11. RADIO COMMUNICATION

Radio communication is on VHF channel 72.

If the frequency channel will be busy, the Race committee shall change communication to channel 73.

12. BOAT ALLOCATION

The allocation of boats will be according to NOR 15.

13. INTENTION TO PROTEST

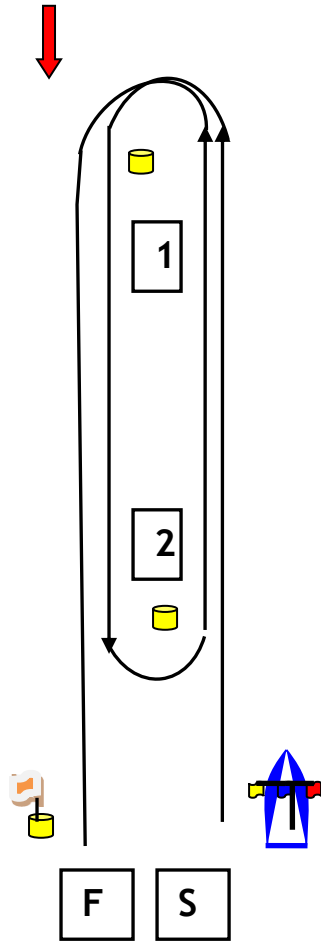
A boat intending to protest is not required to display a red flag. (This changes RRS 60.2.a.1).

A boat intending to protest is required to inform the race committee immediately after finish.

14. PRIZES

The top-3 teams will be awarded with cups.
